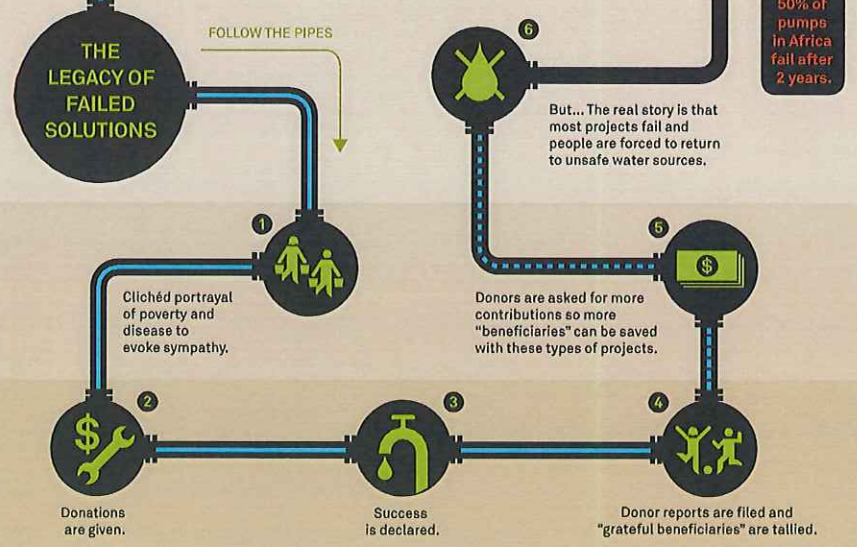

Leveraging Investment

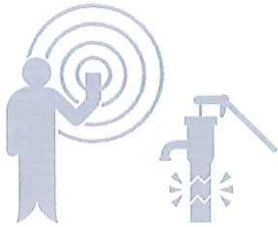
We ensure that investment in development is shared among the local government, the community, and other partners to address current and future challenges of water systems and services.

Monitoring For a Decade

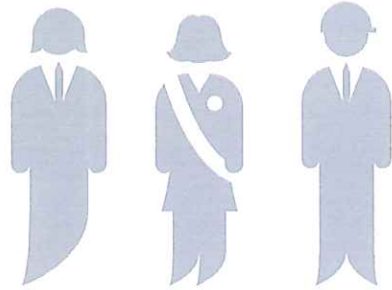
We commit to monitoring our work for at least 10 years after project implementation to ensure that communities have functioning water and sanitation services that meet the needs of the people they serve.
